#### 2. Facilities and Maintenance:

- Ensuring that shelters are clean, safe, and well-maintained is essential in aligning with community expectations. Regular cleaning schedules, proper waste management, and adequate space for animals contribute to a positive environment. Upkeep of outdoor spaces, such as play areas for dogs, can enhance both animal welfare and neighbor perceptions.





### 3. Staff Training and Animal Care:

- Investing in staff training and development is key to effective shelter management. Employees should be trained in animal behavior, health care, and emotional support, allowing them to provide quality care and handle various situations appropriately. This care extends to maintaining mental health and enrichment for animals while in the shelter.

### 4. Community Engagement and Outreach:

- Active engagement with the community through outreach programs can foster trust and collaboration between shelters and residents. Shelters can organize educational workshops, outreach campaigns, and community events that raise awareness about animal welfare, encourage volunteerism, and promote responsible pet ownership.





### **5. Crisis Management and Communication:**

- Developing a crisis management plan for addressing potential issues—such as public complaints, animal intake fluctuations, or emergency situations—is critical to effective shelter management. Transparent communication with the community about operational changes, challenges, or upcoming projects fosters trust and understanding.

#### 6. Feedback Mechanisms:

- Establishing formal channels for community feedback is important for continuous improvement. Shelters can solicit input through surveys, suggestion boxes, or community meetings, allowing residents to voice their concerns and ideas. Actively incorporating this feedback can help shape shelter practices and policies.

### **Indonesian Policy for Animal Shelter**

These regulations are a critical step toward improving the welfare of animals in shelters while also addressing community relations.
